

Cattle from Brungle to Adelaide

News reached town last week, stating that Mr. John Keighran had arrived at the Darling on his way to Adelaide with a large number of cattle and horses from Brungle Plains, Tumut River, New South Wales.

They are chiefly owned by Mr. Rolffe and Mr. Baker, and consist of mixed descriptions and ages.

They are accompanied by a lot of Mr. Newman's cattle from the Darling.
